

They will join Council on 1st January 2014.



Five things you might not know about BMUS 2013

1. The program is structured in a different way this year

to help delegates that are unable to get time off or funding to register for all 3 days. Each day can be treated as a stand alone study day as the content is linked. That means that at BMUS 2013 this year, there are five different study days on each day if you include the Integrated Training Days and satellite sessions. That's 15 in total!

We would of course love to see as many of you as possible there for all 3 days though!

2. The DVT Integrated Training Day is on SUNDAY

i.e. before the conference opens fully. Delegates attending on Sunday receive a complimentary general session day of their choice at the meeting. Those arriving early can sample the heady delights of the only English party city to make the top ten in Europe.

3. Treat yourself

Wednesday 11th December the National AAA Screening Program will hold one of its regular re accreditation events for technicians and CSTs. This is an all day restricted event.

Also on Wednesday in the pm session, the Northern Vascular Surgical Group will hold its Winter Meeting. This event is aimed at Vascular Surgeons, Radiologists, Sonographers and Nurses.

5. Education on the Stands





Get a grip!

Do you want to help with a study on grip strength and ergonomics in ultrasound?



The ultrasound team at City University London would like your help to determine grip strength of ultrasound practitioners and factors that might affect grip strength.

Please come and see us at the conference in Gateshead, where we will measure your maximum grip strength and ask you to complete a questionnaire relating to factors that might affect your grip strength. The study should take about 10 – 15 minutes. We will be doing the study at the beginning of the day, during coffee breaks and over lunch – please look out for us.

We are also recruiting people, who have had any ultrasound experience, to come to City University London for a short training session using an ergometer (machine that beeps when muscles are under strain). How aware were you that October was Medical Ultrasound awareness month?

Or at least it was across the pond.

Medical Ultrasound Awareness Month is a joint effort of the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine (AIUM), American Registry of Diagnostic Medical Sonographers (ARDMS), American Society of Echocardiography (ASE), Cardiovascular Credentialing International (CCI), Society of Diagnostic Medical Sonography (SDMS), and Society for Vascular Ultrasound (SVU).

Every October, SDMS and comrades, join together to promote Medical Ultrasound Awareness Month (MUAM) to increase the public's knowledge about sonography and to promote pride in the sonography profession. One of the goals of Medical Ultrasound Awareness Month is to familiarize and educate the public about medical ultrasound through specially planned activities and educational materials. With ultrasound's increasing role in medicine, there is a need for the general public to understand what ultrasound is and its many uses in health care.

Organisations provide a promotional resources pack, which includes a sample letter to the government asking for support and recognition in these ventures, suggestions of how to get media coverage to promote ultrasound, a timetable of events taking place, such as talks about ultrasound in schools and colleges to promote careers in this field, other educational events, department fundraising fun runs, bake offs etc with proceeds going towards ultrasound based medical research or equipment.

It's a feel good month of positive action, focusing on teamwork, rewarding staff, and spreading knowledge. Not to do things by halves, they sell a large range of ultrasound promotional products such as t-shirts, badges, pens, tote bags. In short, they've created a whole entity of ultrasonic pride.

Given the fact that sonography is not recognised as a profession by the HPC and, therefore there is no mechanism whereby an individual can register with the HPC as a sonographer or be regulated by them as a sonographer, awareness is also key here in the UK.

We have national awareness days and weeks for everything from child safety, to armed forces to facial hair coiffing for a good cause during the aptly renamed 'Movember,' World Teachers Day, Breast Cancer Awareness month, Stoptober to help quit smoking, World Radiography Day to celebrate radiographers and all they do.

There is even a National Sloth Appreciation day to celebrate all they don't do - (19th October in case you were wondering.) Is it sheer coincidence that this overlaps with National Chocolate week 14th - 20th Oct?
